Code of Conduct

Cliff Media is a community-based porn production company that works to promote enthusiastic consent, inclusion, collaboration, and safer spaces. By participating in Cliff Media scenes, you acknowledge and agree to the following:

Enthusiastic Consent for Appearing in Highly Visible Porn

At Cliff Media, we work to share the narratives and empowered sexuality of women, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer (LGBTQ+) folks, Black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC) and people with disabilities. We put our work all over the internet, on the Cliff Media website, social media platforms like FetLife, Twitter, and Reddit, and tube sites like Pornhub and xHamster. Some of our videos have hundreds of thousands or millions of views and appear as recommended content on the front page of tube sites. This means that by attending a Cliff Media shoot, you will be appearing in adult media visible to the broad public on the internet forever.

This is also true of people who attend Cliff Media shoots exclusively as a videographer or behind-the-scenes support. While we don't intentionally film behind-the-scenes participants, incidental, unintentional appearance in footage is common. Anyone on the property during a Cliff Media shoot, including behind-the-scenes support volunteers, must sign release forms and enthusiastically consent to appear in adult content.

We expect and require that people decide in advance whether they want to participate in porn. We don't blur faces or cut people out after the fact. You can always use a stage name and your legal name will never be publicized unless that is your preference. However, your face, body and sex acts will be seen everywhere. You should not consider this to be an anonymous activity. Not only do we not guarantee your anonymity, we urge you to consider that you will likely be recognized.

All participants also receive the content and release forms to market and sell as they wish. Many participants market content on their own social media pages and sell content on platforms like ManyVids, Fansly, Clips4Sale, and LoyalFans. This means that content will not only appear on Cliff Media profiles, but on many creator profiles across multiple platforms.

Even if Cliff Media and other participating content creators did not share content as broadly as we do, posting anywhere online, especially on tube sites, is likely to result in "content scraping". This refers to the automated culling of content by bots and web crawlers that then republish the material on other websites. These websites are outside the control of participating creators.

Many people, including Cliff Media leadership, community volunteers and scene participants put in an enormous amount of work to organize co-performers and directors, develop scene ideas, write scripts, construct props and set, perform in the scene, process and edit content to produce meaningful art to share with the world. This work is also a source of income for Cliff Media as an organization and for other

participating creators. Your choice to join should be made with respect for the seriousness and professionalism of this endeavor.

For all of the above reasons, we do not want anyone attending shoots who may have any reservations about attendance. We strongly encourage people to consider whether participation in porn is what you know you want to do. Participating in porn is not for everyone; only you can know your life circumstances and personal feelings. If you have any doubts about whether you want to appear in highly visible porn for life, you are welcome to attend our clothed community events but we ask that you please do not participate in our porn shoots.

Enthusiastic Consent in Sex Acts and Sexual Health

At Cliff Media, you are never expected to do anything sexually with your body that you don't want to do.

LGBTQ+, BIPOC and people with disabilities in the community take turns coming up with scene plans and directing and leading scenes. However, directors only script the storyline and non-sexual portions of the scene. Once sex begins, the sex acts of performers are based exclusively on the mutual consent of participants.

We begin every scene with an opening consent circle in which participants share their sexual "hell yeses" and "nos". We encourage all participants to listen carefully to their co-performers and make an effort to remember one another's boundaries.

However, consent must still be obtained during the scene in advance of any interaction. That means you must ask your co-performer before touching and before engaging in any particular sexual act.

We encourage participants to ask for what they want during the scene using the phrase "May I [verb] your [noun]?" In some cases, as in the case of a language barrier, consent conversations may be non-verbal, but they must be explicit, such as with a clear non-verbal hand signal for the proposed sex act and clear non-verbal consent, such as a thumbs up.

If you are ever unsure if enthusiastic consent was given, pause and clarify. Enthusiastic consent may also be revoked at any time, including during a sex act. If consent is revoked, you must stop what you are doing immediately.

We strongly encourage performers to use the word "no". We consider "no" a gift to your cop performer because you are expressing your truth about your desires and boundaries. You do not need to have a reason or justify your boundary in any way. No is a complete and perfectly acceptable sentence.

If someone tells you "no" in response to a request to interact, you might respond with something like "thank you for taking care of yourself". Most importantly, you may not continue to interact with that individual. You also may not ask a second time or initiate contact with them again later. "No" is final. The only way you can interact with that person in the future is if they later take initiative to ask to interact with you.

At Cliff Media, our universal safe word is "pause". If someone says "pause", that means cameras stop filming and all participants pause in their sexual interactions. Saying "pause" is never a problem. It's a good thing because it allows us to create safer spaces in real time based on your needs.

There are also no limits on when or why you say “pause”. It can be used for reasons including, but not limited to, someone violating your boundaries, experiencing physical pain, feeling emotionally overwhelmed, someone misgendering you, or a desire for support. We would always rather you say “pause” than proceed with a concern that goes unaddressed.

If at any time during the scene you experience distress, pain, or other physical or emotional concerns of any kind, you can always ask any member of the Whore’s Nest, Cliff Media’s leadership team, to step out of the scene to talk with or help you.

We aim to balance the physical and emotional safety of all performers with our value that we are all messy, awkward and human, including sometimes saying or doing things that unintentionally hurt one another. If you violate someone’s boundaries, depending on the severity of the violation and the emotional needs of the person violated, we may provide you with feedback on site, mediate a conversation between you and the other individual, or ask you to leave, then discuss the issue with you privately in the days following the shoot.

If you violate someone’s boundaries again after being given feedback the first time, you will be asked to leave immediately and we will discuss the issue with you privately in the days following the shoot.

At the discretion of Cliff Media leadership, certain egregious behaviors, such as continuing a sexual interaction after being asked to stop or repeated racist, transphobic or fatphobic remarks, will result in permanent disqualification from Cliff Media shoots.

We encourage you to remember that none of your co-performers are here for your sexual gratification. That means you should not come to a shoot with any expectations about having particular sexual fantasies fulfilled or experiencing orgasm. You may express and ask for sexual interactions you want to have but you must be prepared for the possibility of hearing “no”. We also ask that you do not request people in general or anyone in particular to “help you cum” as this is not the responsibility or purpose of your collaborators.

Enthusiastic consent also applies to sexual health. Everyone present at a shoot has submitted results from STI testing within 30 days of the shoot to attend. However, everyone has different health and personal circumstances and risk tolerance and the decision to use condoms or other barriers when interacting with other people is yours to make.

During the opening circle before the shoot, we encourage everyone to identify whether they would like to interact using condoms or other barriers. We also encourage co-performers to ask for or require condoms or other barriers during the scene.

Co-performers are expected to do their best to remember the boundaries of other participants as stated during the opening circle, but we are also realistic about anyone’s ability to remember everyone else’s boundaries given the large number of co-performers in most of our scenes. Cliff Media leadership also cannot be responsible for or promise that we can ensure co-performers’ use of barriers.

If you wish people to use barriers when interacting with you, it is your responsibility to remind people during the scene of your request.

Content Collaboration

At Cliff Media, our work is based on collaboration, collective growth and long-term relationship building, rather than transactional employment or company-led direction.

This means:

- LGBTQ+, BIPOC and people with disabilities in the community take turns directing scenes.
- The Cliff Media team helps draft scripts based on directors' ideas but, as long as directors' scenes align with Cliff Media core values such as enthusiastic consent, body-positivity and inclusivity, the scenes themselves belong to the directors and the directors can modify or rewrite the scripts as much as they want.
- The Cliff Media team can help with set and props as desired by the director.
- The Cliff Media team will create release form packets and facilitate co-performers signing forms and taking ID pictures.
- The Cliff media team will film the scenes.
- After the scenes are complete, the Cliff Media team will send, within 3 weeks of a shoot: (a) all raw footage, (b) edited versions of the content, (c) screenshots from the footage, and (d) the release form and ID pictures of co-performers. This will be sent via email. If co-performers do not receive the email within 3 weeks, this is likely caused by an email account blocking our email or marking it as spam. Co-performers are encouraged to contact support@cliffmediaproductions.com to ensure their access to the content.

A collaborative approach to content creation also means that Cliff Media is not based on any financial exchange. Performers do not pay money to participate. Performers also are not paid money for participating. We encourage people to participate only if they enthusiastically desire to do so. Compensation is exclusively in the form of creative collaboration and shared ownership of the content by all participants.

Any performer who has a platform on which they sell content can request to include their release form in their packet that Cliff Media gives to co-performers to sign.

Platforms change their policies frequently. Content creators are responsible for monitoring the release form policy changes of the platforms on which they post content and communicating those changes with Cliff Media leadership as relevant.

Some sites allow a 2257 form, the form required by federal law, as sufficient evidence of co-performer consent. We always include these in the standard packet. Other sites, such as Fansly, ManyVids and Pornhub, have their own branded form and we will need to know if you need your platform form included.

As of late 2025, OnlyFans no longer allows signed printed release forms as evidence of consent. If you are an OnlyFans content creator, you will need to go into your account and create an individualized link for each co-performer. After the shoot, you will receive the release form pictures from co-performers which includes all phone numbers and email address. You may use this contact information for the exclusive purpose of sending your OnlyFans release form approval link to your co-performers.

Please note that content creators on OnlyFans have often reported issues with co-performers passing through the biometrics phase of OnlyFans' digital release form process. Although we sincerely wish it were otherwise, if you are an OnlyFans creator, it is worth having reasonable expectations about your

ability to share this content on that particular platform and if creating content to sell on OnlyFans is your only reason for desired participation, Cliff Media may not be the best space for you. Cliff Media can advise on this process but we are unable to facilitate it for you.

Some platforms, such as ManyVids and PornHub, require the uploader to sign forms as well as the co-performer. In order to facilitate the release form process completion at shoots, content creators who upload to such platforms need to arrange with Cliff Media leadership to sign forms as an uploader on any day prior to the shoot itself.

We include all requested release forms in every performer's packet. That means if you are a content creator who has requested a release form for your platform, the form for your platform will appear in everyone's packets including your own. This is so that you can review the packet to confirm that what you need for your platform is present and correct. We do the best we can to ensure everything you need is accurate and included, but if it is not, it is your responsibility to let us know at the shoot before filming begins so we can correct it with all performers on site.

Once the content is distributed, all participants may:

- Share pictures and clips of the content on their social media platforms, such as FetLife, Twitter, Reddit or elsewhere.
- Sell the full-length videos behind paywalls, such as ManyVids, Fansly, LoyalFans, Clips4Sale, FapHouse, and more.
- Post a portion of the video on free tube sites, such as PornHub, xHamster, XNXX or xVideos.

We only place one limit on the ability to share content. No performer may share the full video in its entirety for free online, for example on tube sites like PornHub, xHamster, xVideos or XNXX, because that undermines the ability of every other content creator present to make income from their performance and work.

You can re-edit the content as you wish to fit your platform needs. However, you may not:

- Add AI-generated content superimposed on the video.
- Use titles, captions or graphics with racist, transphobic, homophobic, fatphobic, ageist, or ableist language or any language prohibited by porn site rules.

While some platforms auto-generate titles and tags in a way that makes it difficult for the uploader to control how the content is presented, we expect that, to the extent possible, all participants make an effort to demonstrate respect to their co-performers in the way they present the content.

Non-Disclosure Agreement and Privacy

All participants in Cliff Media shoots are legally committed to maintaining the confidentiality of the sensitive information of their co-performers.

Participating individuals are expected to maintain the following documents confidential:

- All information disclosed in the release forms signed by participants, including legal name, phone number, email address, home address, date of birth, and ID number on the government-issued ID.
- All photos of and information contained in government-issued documents, such as State ID, Driver's License, and Passport, provided through the release form process used to verify legal consent.

The only way that participating individuals may use the above listed information and documentation is to:

- Upload to the administrative side of adult content platforms, such as to comply with the documentation requirements of OnlyFans, Fansly, ManyVids, Clips4Sale, PornHub, or other similar adult sites.
- Contact co-performers if necessary to obtain digital consent for platforms, like OnlyFans, that do not allow for printed release forms.
- Maintain proof of co-performer consent, as required by federal law. This can be stored exclusively in a secure digital folder, such as an encrypted cloud service like Google Drive or on an external hard drive that only you can access. If printed, the documents must be kept in a physical location not accessible by any uninvolved third-parties.

At no time may any of the above listed confidential information be shared with other individuals or organizations, or be made public. Additionally, the contact information contained in the files is to be used exclusively for administrative purposes and not to contact any individuals.

Off-Camera Personal Interactions

Cliff Media is a professional organization in the business of community organizing and media production. The sexual activities that occur in Cliff Media are for professional purposes, including working toward a more inclusive community, modeling consensual, joyful, empowered sexuality, and creating media that has broad social impact.

We expect participants to attend Cliff Media shoots with a commitment to the professional intentions of the space. Cliff Media shoots are not a dating scene, hookup space, or sex club.

The sex that happens during shoots exists within a professional container. Just as you would not assume that you and your therapist are best friends who can hang out just because you've had a good therapy session, you should not assume that positive connections during scenes implies that a co-performer has an interest in further engagement outside of the shoot.

If you do wish to further communicate with a co-performer, we ask that you wait until after the scene and the closing aftercare circle has completed and the individual has had a chance to take care of any of their needs prior to asking if the individual wants to share their contact information to talk further. If they say "no", please do not ask again. Please also do not arrange a hang out or date at the shoot.

Finally, participants have consented to attend a porn shoot in which sex occurs for professional purposes. Participants have not consented to attending a sex party in which sex is happening for personal reasons. Therefore, we ask that people do not engage in off-camera sex during shoots. We also ask that people do not engage, at any time, in off-camera sexual interactions in communal spaces of the Cliff House. Communal spaces are defined as rooms like the living room or kitchen, and any room with a door open.

Respect for All Participants

Cliff Media community is dedicated to the journey of building safer, more loving and inclusive spaces. We recognize that there is no such thing as a space that is perfectly safe, either physically or emotionally, but we work toward this goal.

Part of a safer emotional space is one where all participants are respected. We ask that all participants:

- Treat one another with kindness and dignity.
- Abstain from any discriminatory, harassing or abusive behavior. This includes yelling, bullying, racial slurs, offensive comments, name-calling, threats, or violence.
- Avoid using any language that could be understood as reproducing racism, homophobia, transphobia, ableism, ageism, or fatphobia.
- Change your behavior if you receive feedback that your language may have had unintended consequences.
- Respect the expressed pronouns, gender identity and sexual orientations of other participants. If unsure of someone's pronouns, politely ask. Intentional misgendering is unacceptable.
- Ask for consent prior to touching or sexually interacting with other participants.
- Respect the stated verbal, physical and emotional boundaries of other participants.
- Communicate with other participants in a way that avoids shame and blame. Aim to express personal opinions and experiences rather than judgement of other people.

We understand that we live in a world steeped in inequality and harmful social narratives. We also believe that it is okay to be messy, awkward and human. In this regard, we endeavor to:

- Provide loving feedback when an unintentional boundary violation or disrespectful action occurs.
- Seek to mediate conflict in the pursuit of positive outcomes and solutions.

However, if a participant is unwilling to accept feedback and correct their behavior, repeatedly behaves in a disrespectful manner to other participants, or behaves in a way that is particularly egregious, Cliff Media retains the right to ask anyone to leave.

Physical Safety in Sex and BDSM

The following acts may occur at Cliff Media shoots: sensual and sexual touching, sexual intercourse, domination, submission, bondage, discipline, sadism, masochism, spanking, paddling, rope bondage and suspension, vaginal and anal contact.

At no point do you need to engage in any of the aforementioned activities, or any sex acts for that matter. However, by attending a Cliff Media shoot, you may come into contact with bodily fluids of others, either intentionally or unintentionally. Additionally, if you do choose to engage in any sexual activities at a Cliff Media shoot, you assume the risks inherent in sex and BDSM

The risks of sex and BDSM include serious illness and injury. These risks arise from the nature of the activities themselves as well as from the possible unintentional or intentional conduct of other participants and attendees.

Although all co-performers are required to submit results from testing for Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) within 30 days of a shoot, this is a practice to reduce the health risk but does not eliminate the risk. Choosing to participate in a Cliff Media shoot means that you are knowingly assuming the risk of contracting an STI.

Sex and BDSM kink can be inherently dangerous to the body. Possible health and safety risks include, but are not limited to, bruises, abrasions, lacerations, welts, rope burns, nerve compression, numbness, tingling, neurological damage, sprains, strains, dislocations, friction burns, infections, internal trauma, and mental health distress. This is especially true of BDSM rope play, including bondage and suspension, in which nerve damage, fall injury and emotional distress can be particularly high risks.

These are risks you should assume only with informed consent. You are responsible for making your own personal choices as to what level of risk feels right for you.

If you are experiencing any physical or emotional symptoms at any point during the shoot, it is your responsibility to let someone in the shoot know so that we can help you address your concerns or access medical attention.

Cliff Media does the best that we can within our power to promote a space where other co-performers engage in respectful, consensual, and safe ways. We have clear written and verbal guidelines identifying acceptable behavior. We require all participants to read this Code of Conduct before attending the shoot and we review these guidelines during the opening circle before every scene.

We also take seriously and act swiftly in response to concerns brought to our attention about participant health and safety. However, we cannot anticipate or guarantee the proper behavior of other co-performers and it is your responsibility to choose whether you wish to participate knowing this interpersonal risk.

Prohibited Items and Activities

The following are prohibited at Cliff Media:

- No illegal drugs anywhere in or around the Cliff House property or at Cliff Media shoots at any time.
- No alcohol consumption before or during scenes.
- No guns, toy guns or weapons of any kind, including concealed weapons, sex toys or props.
- No fire, explosives, or illegal activity.
- No smoking indoors.
- No nudity or sexually explicit play in the back or front yard.
- No use of rope or other bondage around the neck.
- No intrusive odors, such as heavy cologne or other heavy smells.
- No one, even friends or other trusted individuals you know, may enter the premises of a Cliff Media shoot without communicating with Cliff Media leadership in advance, submitting ID and STI results and signing a release form.

There are some activities that are prohibited by payment processors and not allowed on porn sites. So that Cliff Media and other participating content creators can share the content publicly, we require that performers adhere to the following limits on behavior in scenes:

- No consensual non-consent. Consent must be stated explicitly by performers within the scene.
- No playing out criminal activity, including roleplays like home invasion, kidnapping, assault, etc.
- No references to illegal activity, prostitution, drugs, alcohol, violence, physical assault, sexual assault, being drunk, drugged, hypnotized or mind controlled.
- No references to incest, self-harm (including anorexia or bulimia), menstruation, or diapers.
- No appearance of weapons of any kind, including guns, toy guns, or knives.
- No appearance of anything that could be construed as alcohol or drugs. To avoid risk of content taken down, we only allow water on camera.
- No appearance of animals or references to bestiality.
- No urine, blood, scat or vomit.
- No more than 3 limbs restrained.
- No long floggers.
- No fire play or electrical play.
- No reference to vampires, zombies, aliens, or cannibalism.

Accountability and Repair

If you experience or witness behavior that violates this Code of Conduct, please contact a member of the Whore's Nest directly or submit feedback to support@cliffmediaproductions.com.

Failure to follow the Code of Conduct guidelines may result in being asked to leave a shoot or uninvited to future shoots. Cliff Media reserves the right to cancel future participation in shoots or events if reports indicate behavior that violates community values or this Code of Conduct.

Anyone using the Cliff House rooms to film independent of Cliff Media is responsible for ensuring that all attendees are over the age of 21, show IDs, and comply with safety practices, enthusiastic consent and respect. The individual coordinating the scene assumes full responsibility for the actions of all individuals they bring into the space and is liable for any violations or misconduct by their attendees.

Assumption of Risk and Release of Liability

By attending a shoot or event with Cliff Media, you acknowledge and agree to the following:

Voluntary Participation and Risk Awareness

My participation at Cliff Media shoots is entirely voluntary. I understand that sex and BDSM-related activities, including but not limited to intercourse, rope bondage, physical restraint, impact play, and power exchange, involve inherent risks of physical injury, sexually transmitted infections, emotional distress or equipment failure.

Any purchases that I make to engage in Cliff Media shoots, such as flights to join from out of town or STI testing at a lab instead of a free public health clinic, are of my own volition and will not be reimbursed by Cliff Media even if I am asked to leave the shoot.

I am responsible for assessing all physical, emotional and financial risks and participating only with fully informed consent.

Release of Liability and Indemnification

I voluntarily assume all risks associated with my attendance and participation at Cliff Media.

I agree to hold harmless Cliff Media LLC, its leadership and associates from any liability, claim, or demand arising from my participation.

This waiver applies only to claims arising from ordinary negligence and does not cover gross negligence, willful misconduct, or unlawful acts as defined by Oregon law.

Age and Capacity

I affirm that I am at least 21 years of age and legally capable of entering into this agreement.

I affirm that I am participating in the shoot and signing this document of my own free will and am neither coerced nor under the influence of alcohol or drugs while signing this document.

Severability

If any provision of this agreement is found unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Jurisdiction

This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Oregon. Any disputes shall be resolved in the courts of Portland, Oregon.

Understanding and Agreement

I have read this Code of Conduct and Liability Waiver and consent to all conditions freely and voluntarily. I acknowledge that I am giving up certain legal rights, including the right to sue for ordinary negligence.
